US News & World Report ranked WHS #6 of 124 high schools in Maine and #684 of 21,776 high schools in the United States.

The School- Wells High School, a part of the Wells-Ogunquit Community School district, is a public high school with a total enrollment of 433 students and 77 faculty and staff. It is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges and by the Maine Department of Educational and Cultural Services.

Our Mission- Our mission is to empower all students through individualized instruction to become literate critical thinkers and problem solvers committed to civic engagement.

The School Schedule:

Wells High School offers a six-period trimester schedule. Classes meet daily for 55 minutes. Full year, 3 trimester courses earn 1.5 credits, 2 trimester courses earn 1.0 credits, and single trimester courses earn 0.5 credits.

Grade Point Average (GPA) is reported on a 100-point unweighted numerical scale.

Class Rank is based on a weighted scale and is calculated twice: once at the beginning of the student's senior year and again after the second trimester.

Course Offerings:

Honors Designation: Indicates the student has chosen more challenging responsibilities & expectations within the course.

Advanced Placement (AP): WHS offers the following 13 AP Courses: Art History, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Computer Science, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, European History, Government & Politics, Physics, Psychology, Statistics, & Studio Art. AP courses earn 2.0 credits and are given a weight of 1.025.

Dual Enrollment Program: In partnership with York County Community College, Juniors & Seniors have the opportunity to earn joint college & high school credits through our Dual Enrollment Program. This program is free to qualified students and is funded through York County Community College, the Maine Department of Education, EMBARK & the Wells-Ogunquit Community School District.

Sanford Regional Technical Center and Portland Arts & Technology High School: WHS Juniors & Seniors may enroll in the vocational offerings of these schools.
